Title of the inspection activities: The thematic inspection in construction companies

Duration of the inspection activities: Six month from April till September 2023

Aim of the inspection activities: To prevent fatal and severe accidents at work

Scope of the inspection activities: Check employees safety and health during construction works

at the sites

Sector covered by inspections: construction industry

The number of establishments inspected in the framework of the activities: 208 companies (it was planned 150 companies)

The number of labour inspectors involved in implementing the inspection activities: 70

The number of persons involved in supervising the implementation of the inspection activities

(including development of inspection documents and summarizing results of inspections): 2

Short summary of the outcome of the inspection activities: During inspection campaign SLI inspectors in 33 cases suspended the work at the construction sites, because employees safety and health was endangered. The SLI inspectors stated sufficient violations during work at high which is the main cause of the fatal accidents at work in construction (fall from the hights). There were also violations during the work in trenches and constructions pits. There were also violations regarding the employees identification cards and workers lists which creates an increased risk of unregistered employment. The SLI will continue to inspect construction

industry every year.
